It is my intent to prepare an agenda for this coming meeting in Newport News, Virginia that will focus on what the membership thinks is important and not on the "business" of VMCCA. The "town hall" meeting held by then President Ray Maxfield at the Chrome Glidden Tour, held in Tennessee, was a great success and well worth replicating for our "Annual Membership Meeting.

Unfortunately, neither the By-laws or the Officers Handbook speak to the issue of the purpose of this meeting. We can assume that the title of the meeting, Annual Membership Meeting, provides us with enough information to properly assume it is a meeting held for the primary benefit of the membership. It is a meeting held for, and to discuss, issues important or relative to the membership. By contrast that would imply the other 4 meetings described in the By-laws would be labeled as "business" meetings where the actual business of the organization is attended to by the Board of Governors.





Remembering the Great History of Pierce-Arrow Advertising

The Pierce-Arrow automobile brand has an interesting history that many historians still talk about today. The Pierce-Arrow Motor Car Company was located in Buffalo, New York and operated from 1901 to 1938. It was well-known for producing expensive luxury automobiles, as well as boats, motorcycles and bicycles in a factory designed by Detroit industrial architect Albert Kahn. The company was formed by George N. Pierce, who was previously involved with manufacturing household items before his interest in automobiles. His first automobile was called the Arrow, which offered an engine mounted in the front of the car. For many years, owning a Pierce-Arrow became a status symbol, as the vehicles were owned by the super-rich or Hollywood stars of the era.





